

# How to Configure Firefox for CAC use on an Apple Computer





#### After you have installed CACkey...


Click Firefox, Preferences...




## Click Advanced(gear), Encryption(tab), Security Devices(button)




#### Click Load(button)




# Type a name like: *CAC Reader* Browse to: your hard disk/library/CACKey/libcackey\_g.dylib then click *OK*




# Below *Security Modules and Devices* you will see *CAC*Reader with your name below it. This means it worked, Click OK




# Try going to a CAC enabled website via Firefox. Example: AKO <a href="https://www.us.army.mil">https://www.us.army.mil</a> Click I understand the risks




# Click Get Certificate (button) then Confirm Security Encryption (button)




### Type your CAC PIN in the *Password Required* box, then select *OK*



### Select the Email Signature Cert (Air Force) AKO uses the NON Email certificate



# You should be logged in now. If you log off, you will be prompted to enter your PIN again



#### You have now enabled Firefox on your Mac to access CAC enabled websites
